## The Present Continuous Tense

The present continuous tense is used to talk about an action that is happening now.

Examples: Kevin and Marty are walking to school.

You are reading this sentence.

## Eimative sentences

## Star Power

When making affirmative sentences about what is happening now, follow this word order:

Pronoun	Verb to be +	the main verb	Rest of sentence
1	am	playing	hockey.
You	are	doing	your homework.
He / She	is	going	to the arena.
We	are	baking	chocolate cookies.
They	are	jogging	in the park.

Note: The main verb ends in ing.

Rule 1 Add ing to the end of the main verb.

Examples: eat = eating

listen = listening

If a verb ends with an e, drop the e and add ing. Rule 2

Examples: have = having

erase = erasing

Usually if a verb ends with a consonant + vowel + consonant, Rule 3

double the consonant and add ing.

Examples: run = running swim = swimming

Rule 4 If a verb ends with ie, change the ie to y and add ing.

Examples: tie = tyling

lie = lyima
