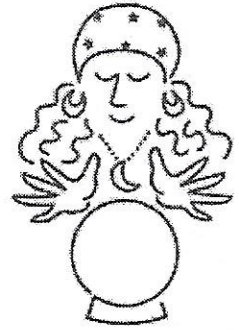

RULES



AFFIRMATIVE SENTENCES

1) Use S. + A. + V. + O. *I will go to summer camp soon.*

I'll go to summer camp soon.

2) Use S. + am/is/are + going to + V. *I am going to move next July.*

I'm going to move next July.

NEGATIVE SENTENCES

3) Use S. + A + not + V. *He will not be in this school next year.*

He won't be in this school next year.

4) Use subject + "to be" + not going to + verb

We are not going to go to the movies tomorrow.

We aren't going to go to the movies tomorrow.

INTERROGATIVE SENTENCES

5) Use A. + S. + V. *Will you write to me?*

Will you respond to my letter?

6) Use "Am/Is.Are" + S. + going to + V.

Are they going to play hockey tonight?


FUTURE • WILL
Uses

TO EXPRESS AN ACTION THAT WILL TAKE PLACE IN THE FUTURE.

Tomorrow I **will talk** on the phone. Tomorrow I **will not talk** on the phone. (won't)

Affirmative

SUBJECT	+	WILL	+	INFINITIVE VERB	+	COMPLEMENT.
I		will		have		a hamster tomorrow.
She		will		be		home after school.
They		will		go		to Chicago.

Negative Form

SUBJECT	+	WILL NOT WON'T	+	INFINITIVE VERB	+	COMPLEMENT.
I		will not		be		home when you call.
I		won't		sing		with my class.
I		will not		go		to this high school.

Question Form

WILL	+	SUBJECT	+	INFINITIVE VERB	+	COMPLEMENT?
Will		you		come		with me?
Will		they		be		ready?
Will		she		have		her book?
