

Future Tense

The future tense is used to talk about an action that is going to happen tomorrow, next week, in sixty years, etc. You also use it when you are guessing or making a promise.



AFFIRMATIVE	NEGATIVE	QUESTION
Will + verb	Will+ not + verb	Start with will
She will give it to you tomorrow.	She will not give it to you tomorrow.	Will you give it to me tomorrow?

Use the future tense to create a sentence.

	Affirmative
To walk	Tomorrow, I will walk home from school.
To talk	In two days, I will talk to my friend.
To decide	Next week, I will decide what to buy at the grocery store.
To write	Tomorrow, I will write a journal.
To exercise	In two weeks, I am going to exercise.

	Negative
To discuss	I am not going to discuss the weather with my family tomorrow.
To skip	I will not skip around the block in two days.
To cry	I am not going to cry tomorrow.

	Question
To help	Are you going to help me with my English tomorrow?
To shoot	Will you shoot your Nerf gun next week?
To sing	Am I going to sing in the school band next year?
