## HOW TO ASK QUESTIONS WITH THE VERB TO BE

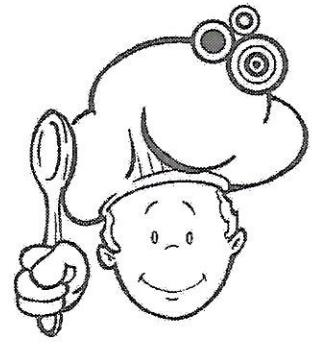
**DID YOU KNOW?** 

We use this structure for yes/no questions with the verb to be:

Verb (V)	Subject (S)	Object (O) – Rest of the question
Am	I	your best friend?
Are	you	good at video games?
Is	he	taller than you?
Is	my sister	funny in class?
Is	it	expensive to buy a Ferrari?
Are	we	going to the restaurant?
Are	they	with you in English class?
